Excellent physical conditions are requerided.
First day of course all students must pass a physical test including:
(Bar pull-ups, Floor pull-ups, Tight feet long jump, Hop, Speed 60 meters, 1000 m. run
Each test is rated IAW O.M. 522/00118/85 (D.O.E.A. num. 7). It is necessary to achieve a minimum mark in each individual test, and to reach a total of 24 points.
ADMINISTRATIVE:
Students are required to present an up-to-date medical certificate to provide proof of their ability to pass the physical fitness test.

- Interact on the field with other professions such as A/C maintenance, Rescue and Medical teams.

Participate in a multinational CCA- and decontamination team

G. Skills and level of qualification required: Before entering the course, the participants should have a basic knowledge on CBRN-defence. They should be familiar with generic techniques for the decontamination of personnel and equipments.

Language skill: **2-2-1-2** (according to STANAG 6001)

- H. Charges (accommodation, food, fees, etc): Costs: Each nation pay their own costs for participating (travels, accommodations, meals etc). No conference fee will be charged.
- I. Number of visiting participants and/or observers offered: The participants should be is Air Force OF 1-2 and OR 6-7 with CBRN-defence as their main or secondary role. The course is also open to personnel from other services that may be providing decontamination support to air assets.
- J. Remarks: English or Swedish, depending on the audience.
